Bath County High School is a comprehensive five-year public high school enrolling 258 students in grades 8-12. The school opened in the fall of 1956.

ENROLLMENT: 249 in grades 8th – 12th

SENIOR CLASS: 47 Students:
 40% plan to attend 4-year colleges
 45% plan to attend community colleges
 8% plan to attend career/technical schools

SCHOOL YEAR: 2 semesters = 4 quarters, 9 weeks each, 7 courses per day

ACCREDITATION: Virginia Department of Education and the Southern Association of Colleges and High Schools

COMMUNITY: Bath County is a small rural county of approximately 5000 residents located in the central Alleghany Mountains of Virginia. Most residents are employed in hotel/lodging, school system, and forestry industries.

CLASS RANK: A cumulative grade point average and class rank are computed on all subjects of students from 9th through 11th grade at the end of each school year as the class credits are awarded, and again at the end of the first semester of the senior year and finally after graduation. Classes that are taken in the 8th grade which receive high school credit are included in the grade point average and class rank.

GPA CALCULATION: When determining the grade point average (GPA) of a student, an additional seven (7) points on each semester grade is added to the following courses: Dual-enrollment (DE) and Governor's School (GS) courses which are transferable to a four-year college and Advanced Placement (AP) Courses, if the student takes the AP exam. Weighted courses are: AP VA/US History, AP Calculus, AP Biology, GS Pre-Calculus I and II, GS/AP Statistics I and II, GS College Physics I and II, GS Calculus I and II, DE American National Politics, DE State and Local Politics, DE Principles of Psychology, DE Introduction to Speech Communications.
