School Board members received updates on the project by representatives from BARC Electric, Reliable Energy Concepts and subcontractor, Affordable Energy Concepts. Mr. Jamie Lowry, BARC Manager of Construction Services, said Mrs. Hirsh would receive a Notice of Completion prior to the January meeting. Mr. Lowry explained the importance of the approval of the Notice of Completion as Bath County Schools move toward ownership and maintenance of the Solar Project.

Mr. David Walls, Reliable Energy Concepts, said that Bath County Schools received a 1,055-kilowatt system instead of the originally planned 935-kilowatt system. He noted an extra production of about 95,000 kilowatt hours at no extra cost. Mr. Walls said the close-out material binders included complete documents, production estimates, installation, panels/ roof penetrations, data sheets, warranties, manuals, operation, maintenance materials, power guards and were provided to school principals and superintendent. Mr. Alex Haney, AFC, said it was really cool to work on a school he previously attended (Bath County High). He said work at MES and BCHS are complete. The roof arrays at VES are complete, but work continues on ground arrays at VES. Mrs. Hirsh said the work is not finished, but very close. Mr. Ryder inquired about voltage in case of an emergency. Mr. Wall assured Mr. Ryder that a rapid shut down monitoring system is in place. He said he has never had a panel catch fire as nothing is flammable. Mr. Wall said staff members have one month to view "binders" prior to their January meeting. He suggested Bath County Schools contact their insurance company to provide coverage for the solar panels attached to the roof.

- On behalf of BARC and CoBank who matched funds, Mr. Lowry presented a scholarship check in the amount of \$2,000 to the Bath County School system. Mrs. Hirsh accepted the check and said each school had submitted a proposal for the use of possible grant funds. **17-18: 130 (Con't.)
