Dr. Miller provided background information: The VSBA and Norfolk City School Board are filing suit requesting the Court to invalidate the legislation enacted by the General Assembly at its 2013 session creating the OEI and the Opportunity Educational Institution Board. VSBA and Norfolk City School Board are requesting the court to declare the OEI legislation unconstitutional and to enjoin the OEI Board from taking any action to implement the legislation. On motion by Dr. Miller and seconded by Mrs. Gwin, the Board (5-0 vote) adopted a resolution supporting a lawsuit brought forth by VSBA and the Norfolk City School Board to declare the Opportunity Educational Institution (OEI) legislation unconstitutional and to enjoin the OEI Board from taking any action to implement the legislation, with the understanding there is no financial obligation to Bath County Schools.

Mrs. Gwin and Mrs. Hirsh recently attending the VSBA Legislative Advocacy Conference and updated the Board on OEI information presented during the meeting.
