A. 2013-14 Division Calendar Update

As of February 28, there have been 14 school closings, 8 delayed openings and 1 early dismissal due to inclement weather, 4 additional planned early releases have occurred as well.

The forecast for early next week indicates the possibility of additional school closings.

The Board may want to consider action to recover some of the lost instructional time.

Bath County Public Schools Make-Up Days

following text is from Virginia Code: § 22.1-98

- B. Except as provided in this section:
- 1. The length of every school's term in every school division shall be at least 180 teaching days or 990 teaching hours in any school year; and
- 2. If the length of the term of any school or the schools in a school division shall be less than 180 teaching days or 990 teaching hours in any school year, the amount paid by the Commonwealth from the Basic School Aid Fund shall, except as otherwise hereinafter provided or as otherwise provided by law, be reduced in the same proportion as the length of the school term has been reduced in any school or the schools in the school division from 180 teaching days or 990 teaching hours.
- C. Notwithstanding the requirements of subsection B, in any case in which severe weather conditions or other emergency situations, as defined in this section, result in the closing of a school or the schools in a school division, the amount paid by the Commonwealth from the Basic School Aid Fund shall not be reduced if the following schedule of make-up days is followed:
 - 1. When severe weather conditions or other emergency situations have resulted in the closing of a school or the schools in a school division for five or fewer days, the school or the schools in the school division shall make up all missed days by adding teaching days to the school calendar or extending the length of the school day;
 - 2. When severe weather conditions or other emergency situations have resulted in the closing of a school or the schools in a school division for six days or more, the school or the schools in the school division shall make up the first five days plus one day for each two days missed in excess of the first five by adding teaching days to the school calendar or extending the length of the school day; or
 - 3. When severe weather conditions or other emergency situations have resulted in the closing of any school in a school rision and such school has been unable to meet the 180 teaching day requirement, the school division may make up the missed teaching days by providing its students with instructional hours equivalent to such missed teaching days to meet the minimum 990 teaching hour requirement.

SUBJECT: School Calendars and Make-up Days

As a result of numerous inquiries we have received due to this winter's weather, we are reminding you of the requirements for instructional time in the school year. Section 22.1-98 of the Code of Virginia, the Regulations Establishing Standards for Accrediting Public Schools in Virginia (SOA), at 8 VAC 20-131-5 et seq. and the Regulations Governing Reduction of State Aid When Length of School Term Below 180 Teaching Days or 990 Teaching Hours, at 8 VAC 20-521-10 et. seq., require school divisions to provide instruction for a minimum of 180 days or 990 hours each school year. If the school division cannot meet the requirement for 180 days or 990 hours of instruction because of bad weather or other emergencies, days missed must be made up in accordance with the formula outlined in the Code, which requires that the school division must make up the first five days, and then make up one day for every two days missed in excess of the first five days missed by adding teaching days to the school calendar or extending the length of the school day. School divisions may use instructional time built into the school calendar that exceeds the 990 instructional hour minimum or add time to the remaining days to offset the days missed.

However, § 22.1-98 of the *Code* goes on to say: "...the Board of Education (Board) may waive the requirement that school divisions provide additional teaching days or teaching hours to compensate for school closings resulting from a declared state of emergency." On February 11, 2014, Governor Terry McAuliffe declared a <u>state of emergency</u> due to the major winter storm event based on weather forecasts. Section 22.1-98 of the *Code of Virginia* defines a declared state of emergency to mean "the declaration of an emergency before or after an event, by the Governor or by officials in a locality, that requires the closure of any or all schools within a school division." If the local school board desires a waiver, it must submit a request to the Board. The request shall include evidence of efforts that have been made by the school division to reschedule as many days as possible and certification by the division superintendent and chairman of the local school board that every reasonable effort for making up lost teaching days or teaching hours was exhausted before requesting a waiver of this requirement. If the waiver is denied, the school division shall make up the missed instructional time in accordance with the requirements referenced here.

We also received inquiries regarding the instructional time requirements found in $\underline{8 \text{ VAC } 20\text{-}131\text{-}80}$, $\underline{8 \text{ VAC } 20\text{-}131\text{-}110}$ of the SOA for elementary and middle schools and high

school credit bearing courses. Should you find that you are unable to meet those requirements, you may seek a waiver from the Board as provided for in the standards.

A number of school divisions have also asked if the spring 2014 *Standards of Learning* (SOL) test dates will be revised. At this time, there are no plans to change the statewide testing windows for the SOL tests.
