The state winner will receive \$20,000 in technology equipment for their school. A WDBJ Channel 7 video segment of BCHS technology students provided information on the contest. Mr. Ozols said the kids are designing tools to measure weather in Bath County. Students are attempting to take data and predict weather information. They are designing tools to measure weather and developing programs to make predictions with the data. The technical drawing class is designing equipment using the 3-D printer and the programming class is writing codes that will be used to analyze data. Mrs. Hirsh praised Mr. Ozols saying he has coordinated a fusion of science, technology, engineering and math and it's definitely 21st century problem-solving skills.
