The Bath County School Board met in a Regular Meeting on Tuesday, June 2, 2015 at 7:00 P.M. following a Closed Meeting at 5:30 P.M. at Millboro Elementary School.

Dr. Ellen Miller, Board Chair, called the meeting to order at 5:36 p.m. with all 14-15: 276 CALL TO ORDER members present.

On motion by Mr. Ryder and seconded by Mr. Manion, the Board (5-0 vote) convened in a closed meeting at 5:36 p.m. to discuss the appointment, CLOSED MEETING resignation, retirement of specific personnel and conduct an exit interview.

Mr. Bradley presented a brief report of recent and upcoming events. He thanked 14-15: 284 Mrs. Hirsh and Board members for the opportunity to serve on the Board.

STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE'S REPORT

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Mr. Robert Thomas, Owner and President of Prograss Synthetic Turf Systems had previously spoken with Board member, Mrs. Lowry, about making a presentation to the Board. He anticipated a cost of \$500,000 to \$600,000 to install this type of surface at the BCHS football field. Mr. Thomas said grants and leasing options are available. He said the playing surface has a lifespan of approximately fifteen years and replacement of the field would cost half the original price. Mr. Thomas cited several advantages including: safer playing field, less injuries, savings in overall maintenance costs, games/practices may be played during inclement weather and the field may serve as a revenue generating opportunity. Mrs. Lowry said she sees this as a joint venture with the County since the field is also used for youth league football and other community events such as Relay for Life. Mr. Thomas plans to present information to the Board of Supervisors in the future.

On motion by Mr. Manion and seconded by Mr. Ryder, the Board (5-0 vote) authorized the superintendent to approve resignations and advertise/fill vacancies during the summer.

On motion by Mrs. Lowry, and seconded by Mrs. Grimm the Board (5-0 vote) approved the resignation/retirement requests as listed:

Mary Criser-retirement, Rebecca Derharoutian-resignation, Dawn Duncanretirement, Dale Etzel-resignation and Kristina Pasco-resignation.

Mr. Lancaster, Director of Technology, Testing and Administrative Services, provided background information on Bath County Schools' alternative education program, Project RETURN. The program provides nearly \$10,000 of hardware and software each year for students who need online coursework, whether for credit recovery or an extra course that may not have fit into their schedule or to provide coursework in an alternate setting at school or home to accommodate medical and behavioral needs. Staff support is provided by a school counselor and computer lab manager for encouragement/assistance, and to monitor student progress. Most students participate in the program in the school resource lab, though there are also students who access the internet-based software from home.

PROJECT RETURN FOR
SY2015-16 –

On motion by Mrs. Lowry and seconded by Mrs. Grimm, the Board (5-0 vote) approved continued participation in Project RETURN for the 2015-2016 school year.

Mr. Lancaster said our internet provider for Bath County High School will change to MGW-Lingo Networks in July. As part of the changeover, the company plans to install fiber optic lines to the school, and have requested an easement to bury the cable. The line will come down the mountain behind the high school, run between the parking lot and the VDOT road to the retirement community, and then cross through the (current) gravel parking lot to near where the current parking light pole is set (near the crosswalk). MGW-Lingo will bore under the road and sidewalk to the lower atrium area, where the cable will enter the building. Mr. Lancaster said the easement document will be shared with school attorney, Mr. Singleton. He said the easement document offers assurance that MGW Lingo Networks will repair/restore the ground once the fiber optic lines have been installed. Mr. Lancaster said the schools have communicated with Mattern & Craig to ensure coordination with the parking lot project.

On motion by Mr. Ryder and seconded by Mr. Manion, the Board (5-0 vote) approved an easement agreement with MGW Lingo Networks to install fiber optic lines to BCHS, with the provision that the easement is permanent as long as MGW Lingo Networks are providing service to the schools.

On motion by Mrs. Lowry and seconded by Mrs. Grimm, the Board (5-0 vote) approved 1st reading of VSBA Policies: BBBB, BBBC (Option 1), BBFA (Option 1), BCC, BCG, BDC, BDDD, BDDE, BFE, CHD, CM, DB, DJ, EBAB, GAD, GAE/JHG, GB, GBA/JFHA, GBEB, GBR, GC, GEA/JOH, IC/ID, IGAH, IGAJ (Optional), IKEB, JCJ, JEC, JEC-R, JFCD, JFHA/GBA, JHG/GAE, JJAC, JO, JOH/GEA, KFB, LBD (with the exception of JHCC – Communicable Diseases).

On motion by Mrs. Lowry and seconded by Mrs. Grimm, the Board (5-0 vote) 14-15: 290 approved a one year contract for Speech and Language services with Dr. Gary APPROVAL OF Pillow at \$68 an hour.

SPEECH AND LANGUAGE CONTRACT WITH DR. PILLOW

Citing a previous school safety audit, Mr. Lancaster addressed the Board 14-15: 291 regarding trees and shrubs causing the following safety/security concerns at TREE PRUNING AND/ BCHS and VES: potential hiding places, too close to buildings/gutters, access to OR REMOVAL OF TREES roof from tree tops, and damage to school buildings. He said some of the AT BCHS & VES shrubs/trees are damaged and diseased and are included in the project. Mr. Lancaster said the project is to be completed in the current year budget. He Lancaster identified three oak trees at the south corner of VES which may be pruned or removed and offered two options to the Board:

MR. LANCASTER

- 1. At a cost of approximately \$10,000, the project included: trimming/pruning shrubs and/or tree removal (stump grinding, re-sod) which were identified in the powerpoint presentation at BCHS and VES (three oak trees at VES to be pruned only).
- 2. At a cost of an additional \$1,000 (total \$11,000), trim and prune shrubs/trees as identified in Option 1 at BCHS and VES and removal of three oak trees at the south corner of VES.

A motion was made by Mr. Ryder and seconded by Mr. Manion to proceed with Option 2 (including removal of three oak trees at VES) and ask the Garden Club for assistance when selecting replacement shrubs and/or trees. No vote taken.

A substitute motion by Mrs. Grimm and seconded by Mr. Ryder, the Board (3-2 vote, Lowry, Miller opposed) approved the project (Option 1) to prune/remove trees and shrubs at BCHS and VES as presented, with the exception of three trees at VES. Board members plan to visit/view the three VES trees prior to a decision to prune or remove them.
