Mr. Justin Rider updated the Board on recent legislation (Senate Bill 1162 and House Bill 2178) allowing school divisions to elect to allow eligible employees to use an employer-sponsored hybrid 403(b) plan for employee voluntary contributions to the Hybrid Retirement Plan. According to Mr. Rider, by not allowing the option, VRS (not Bath County School Board) is responsible for the fiduciary and administrative duties associated with sponsorship of such a plan, including the development and maintenance of plan documents, compliance with applicable state and federal laws, investment selection and oversight, and acting in the best interest of a plan's members and beneficiaries, among other responsibilities. On motion by Mrs. Lowry and seconded by Mr. Manion, the Board (5-0 vote) adopted a Virginia Retirement System resolution selecting the "not to offer" option, so that hybrid voluntary contributions will continue to be directed into the VRS Hybrid 457 Deferred Compensation Plan only.
