With funding from GE Wind--- KidWind will hold a National KidWind Challenge at the WindPower 2016 Expo in New Orleans.

Like the event in 2014 this event this will highlight a collection of top entries from all of the regional and online challenges and will offer a range of prizes and activities.

The National KidWind Challenge will be held at <u>WindPower 2016</u> -- This is the largest North American Conference on Wind Energy and features engineers, developers and other who are in the wind energy space. If you are interested in wind energy -- all the geeks are here.

Our event will be co-located with the <u>Collegiate Wind Competition</u> which is like the KidWind Challenge but for college students. We will be competing side by side!





We understand that additional fundraisers will be needed to help defray the cost. If fundraisers allow or we find less expensive plane tickets, we will be able to further defray the student cost.

The Bath County High School Beta Club had six students qualify for The National Convention to be held in New Orleans in June. This trip is a once in a lifetime opportunity for our students and we would love to be able to represent our small school on the national level. Because of the great distance of this trip, the only way that it is financially feasible for us to make this trip is by air. Traveling by plane allows us shorter time away, less nights in a hotel room, and fewer meals to be paid by the club/ and or students. You will see the details below of why we believe the only feasible way for us to travel is by air.

Air Timeline- Fly out June 27, Return on June 30 **Bus Timeline** - Travel down June 26, return July 1

You can see from the attached quotes given to us by two separate bus companies that the costs are quite exorbitant for 9 people (Quick's-\$890 per person and Venture Tours-\$1490 person). These companies can only offer us charter buses as our mode of transportation and therefore cost much more per person than plane tickets. Travelling by bus would also mean traveling for two additional days. This means adding the costs of two extra nights of hotel rooms, the cost of an extra room for a bus driver, and also the addition of 6 more meals. With all of these taken into consideration it is not financially possible for us to make the trip to Louisiana if bus is the expected transportation.

If approved to travel via air, the cost for plane tickets would be approximately \$580 a person (including taxes and fees). Traveling by air the students will be responsible for 11 meals (Monday- 2; Tuesday- 3; Wednesday 3; Thursday 3). There would only be three nights of lodging and we would require three rooms. Costs through the National Beta Club room blocks are \$179 a room. We also explored hotel rooms through the Omni Resort using our connections through The Homestead. Rooms at the Omni New Orleans are \$79 a room.

We have explored all options for travel to our national convention. We appreciate you all considering the many facets and working parts of this trip and hope that you will allow our students the opportunity to attend and represent Bath County in such a positive way.
