On March 16, 2016, I conducted a voter registration drive at Bath County High School. I received registrations from 37 individuals, including three from other jurisdictions. To put this in perspective, the 34 voters added to the rolls in Bath County amount to 1% of the total voters registered in the county—not bad for one day.

The members of the Electoral Board and I would like to thank you and your staff for the cooperation necessary to make this a success. In particular, Jami Fussell of the GRASP program took it upon herself to contact me, and make the necessary arrangements at the High School while I was busy with the Presidential Primary.

In addition, James Lucente set aside class time in his two senior government classes for me to speak with the students, and circulate registration forms. I can think of no better government lesson than to learn and participate in the voting process. Principle Sarah Rowe kept abreast of the registration activities, and provided support for my being in the classroom and in the hallway at lunch time.

The voter registration office would like to make this voter registration drive at the high school an annual or semi-annual event. The Governor's office and the Department of Elections are beginning a statewide drive to register eligible high school students. As in so many other areas, Bath County schools are already ahead of the curve.

The teams recently competed in Virginia Beach in the wind turbine design contest. Teams design energy efficient turbines and compete. Bath County won first and second place.

Students in the career and technical education center from electricity, carpentry and technology education work together to put the wind turbines together.

"Each student comes in with their own expertise and they learn how to work together," said Ed Ozols, technology and engineering teacher at Bath County High School.
