He also said we are losing baseball and girls basketball coaches after this year. Baseball repair has been moved to 2020 and he asked the Board to take action before someone gets hurt. He urged the Board to think about coaches when replacing P. E. teacher, Keith Lindsay.

Mrs. Lowry

- Thanked everyone for their assistance in getting ready for the Celebration of the Arts program. Commended Mr. Scott Reese for his assistance to the BCHS band program. Congratulated Mrs. Hooker on another reinforcement of her passion and accomplishments.
- Addressing the budget, she invited anyone in doubt to step into the schools to see that their money is well spent. Believes staff is greatly underpaid for the work they do with our students. Can't ignore the passion and expertise of everyone in the school system. We don't have wants in our budget, only needs. Everyone needs to advocate for our kids.
- Speaking of KidWind, said she is a proud of her son, team members and sponsors for their accomplishments in Roanoke and all the way to New Orleans last year. No doubt they will take Chicago by storm as well. Donations may be sent to BCHS or VES. Approximately \$15,000 is needed to fund the trip. Some parents are planning to go and are paying their own way. Any remaining funds will be kept in a line item in the budget for future trips. As a parent who plans to attend, she is advocating for 515 students and their safety on the trip.

Mr. Burns

- Approached by quite a few people about the tragedies that have been happening in public schools recently and in the past. He has heard comments such as how much is a life worth? How much are my children worth to me? A young lady told him that our goal as a school board, above all, should be safety for all children. He said recent changes to our crisis management plans are complete and teams are in place throughout the school system. There is no price on a child's life because they are priceless. He cautioned the Board not to allow fear to allow us to be pushed, guided and led astray. If we make plans or provisions in fear, we might make the wrong decisions. The only thing we can do is access the situation, strategize, plan and act. To implement actions, we must have funds and unfortunately we don't have an unlimited supply of money. Concerned that all bodies in this county are not unified.
- Excited about the good news in our school system. Kudos to everyone in the school system who support our students and promote their profound successes in regional, state and national competitions. Impressed with the state of the art 20th century learning students are experiencing at Bath County Schools.
- Apologized to Mr. Phillips, saying "we would fix the baseball field in a heartbeat
 if we had the funds". State and federal government things must be done in
 order.
- Thanked everyone for coming out tonight and said the Board does encourage public to attend the school board meetings. When an unfortunate event occurs and the regular meeting needs to be moved, it is definitely not because the board doesn't want anyone to attend.

Mr. Secoy

- It's the time of the year for budget discussions. During the recent school open
 meeting (budget public hearing), there was zero feedback to the school board
 regarding the budget. He respectfully requested that public/community
 members attend meetings to provide feedback, ask questions, and make
 suggestions regarding upcoming budgets.
- Board members are often approached at their work places regarding school happenings. He urged individuals to contact board members at their homes, via e-mail, and by leaving messages. He encouraged everyone to attend the board meetings saying without feedback, we don't know what you want.
- Asked Mr. Ozols if a Go Fund Me account would be set up for the KidWind trip.
 Said he would be happy to share the site with every person he knows.
